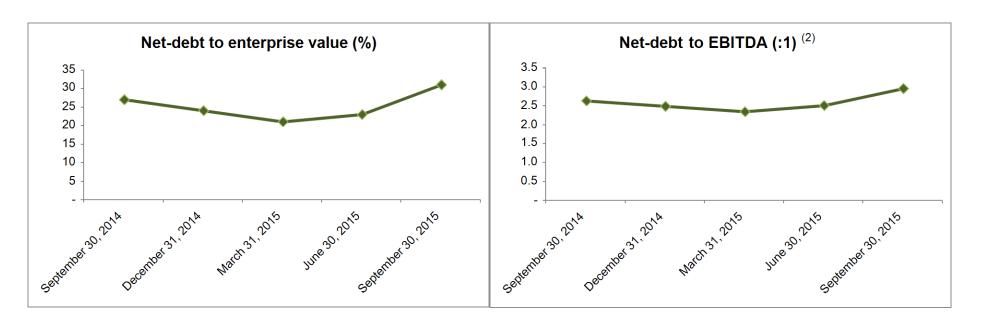

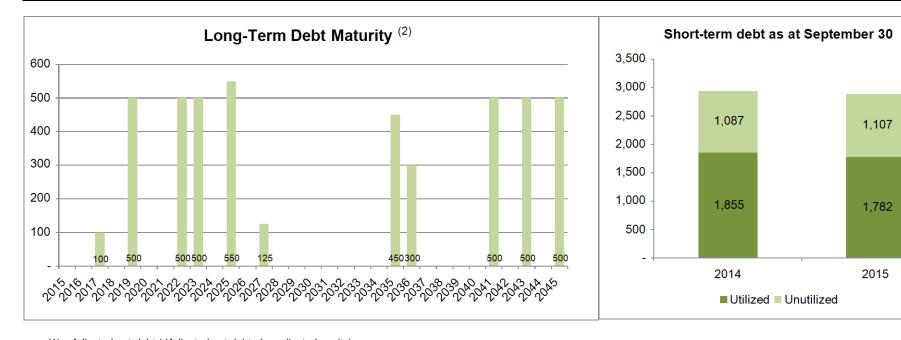

Key Assumptions and Risks in Respect of Forward-looking Statements

For our anticipated annualized dividends for 2015, we have estimated cash available for distribution for the sole purpose of determining our initial annual distribution rate. The methodology upon which we make the determination is not necessarily intended to be a basis for future dividends or other distributions. The key assumptions that we have made include, among other things, assumptions about Agrium's ability to successfully integrate and realize the anticipated benefits of its already completed and future acquisitions; that future business, regulatory and industry conditions will be within normal parameters, including assumptions about prices, margins, product availability and supplier agreements; the completion of our expansion projects on schedule, as planned and on budget; assumptions about global economic conditions; the market outlook for our key products; and our ability to access our credit facilities or capital markets for additional sources of financing.
